Guided Pathways Dimensions

There are Four Dimensions of the Pathways Model:

- 1. Clarify paths to student end goals
- Help students choose and enter a pathway
- 3. Keep students on path
- 4. Ensure that students are learning

Support students beginning "with the end in mind" from first contact until employment or transfer.

- Select recommended elective courses



Program Description: The Associate of Arts (A.A.) degree is designed for the student who plans to transfer to a Florida public university as a junior to complete a Bachelor's degree. A student who earns an A.A. degree from Broward College meets the lower division general education requirements of a Florida state university, but does not automatically meet the requirements for a particular major.


HELP STUDENTS CHOOSE AND ENTER A PATH

HELP STUDENTS CHOOSE AND ENTER A PATH

- Develop meta-majors or career clusters.
- Develop a Job Placement/Transfer System.
- Create common coursework for the first 25% of the enrollment for each Career and Academic Community.
- Provide experiential learning opportunities (e.g. job shadowing, internships, informational interviewing).
