





### **Risk Factors**

- Lack of alignment across the K-12 and postsecondary systems
- Rapidly escalating college cost
- Complexity of our financial aid system

- Inability to assess educational quality
- Dramatic gaps in attainment between white students and students of color

29% 6-year graduation rate




- **Insufficient support** for students to navigate all the course and program options

- Few meaningful connections to other sectors, such as K-12, 4-year institutions, business and industry, and employers


























### What We Would Expect to See

- . Dramatic increases in completion
- Closed attainment gaps by race and ethnicity
- Increased employment and premiums in earnings as a result of credential attainment

#### **College Completion Rate**



The Share of Adults (age 25-34) Attaining Postsecondary Degrees (associate degree or above).











